Mountain View Dual Language Immersion Program Receives Professional Development Grant—Mountain View Elementary School (MVES) received a \$10,000 Virginia Department of Education (VDOE) mini-grant to support teacher training that enhances literacy instruction for students learning in two languages.

As part of this grant, MVES has already hosted a professional development session for Spanish Language Arts teachers to explore instructional resources and to ask targeted questions about the curriculum. In September, a three-hour session for both Spanish and English Language Arts teachers will focus on best practices in dual language instruction and collaborative planning.

England Retires from Crozet Elementary, Saunders to Take Helm in July—Crozet Elementary School will undergo a leadership transition at the end of the school year as Principal Staci England retires after four years of service to the Crozet community. Stephen Saunders, currently principal of Greer Elementary School, has been appointed as Crozet’s next principal and will begin his role on July 1, 2026.

The transfer of Saunders from Greer to Crozet leaves an opening for the Greer principal position. Haas noted that ACPS will begin the process of selecting the next principal of Greer Elementary School by engaging with the students, staff and families of the Greer community.

ACPS Chief Technology Officer Announces Retirement—After eight years with Albemarle County Public Schools (ACPS), Chief Technology Officer Christine Diggs announced that she will be retiring at the end of the 2025-26 school year.

With the announcement, the Department of Human Resources has begun the search for ACPS’ next Chief Technology Officer. As part of this process, ACPS employees, students and families are invited to complete a brief survey to share their input on the qualities they value most in the next leader. This feedback will help shape interview questions and ensure candidates are evaluated based on how well they can meet the needs of the division. The survey is available in English, Spanish, Arabic and Chinese.

Haas is expected to present his recommendation for the next Chief Technology Officer to the Albemarle County School Board in mid-May, with a July 1, 2026, start date.
