

Background

A survey was prepared to obtain community input on the recommendations for placenaming of the area near the Rio Road/Route 29 intersection, developed by SIR as directed by VDOT. The survey was distributed using the following methods:

- Email (332 contacts)
 - Places29 Community Advisory Committees
 - Albemarle County's business contact list for 29 Solutions
 - Albemarle County's homeowners/neighborhood association contact list for those in the Places29 Master Plan area
- Facebook (969 people reached)
- Twitter (1,644 followers)


The survey was open for one week and received 80 responses. A copy of the full survey results are provided at the end of this document.


Summary Findings

1. How familiar are you with the area around the Rio Road/Route-29 Intersection?


Most respondents were very familiar with the area, with an average rating of 4.6 on a scale from 1 to 5 (5 being very familiar).

2. What words or names do you use to describe the location of the shops and businesses near the Rio Road-Route 29 intersection?




According to the comments, there is a high level of concern among respondents that most people don't relate to cardinal directions. A more relatable reference is stores/businesses.

8. What changes would you make to the description for the corner directions?


(Individual corner responses are provided in the appendix, but feedback generally raised the same issues throughout)

Respondents identified that cardinal directions do not resonate with most people and that identifying landmark businesses and stores is more useful. Others recommended to select landmarks further from the immediate area, like the University and Washington, DC.

9. If "Rio" is used for the signage to direct traffic through this area, SIR has recommended taking the concept to another level to support marketing efforts on behalf of businesses located there, something that identifies the area as a destination of its own. One idea is "Rio Ville". What do you think about this name? Does "Rio Ville" resonate with you?

2. According to SIR's findings, the word "Rio" is used by 7 in 10 area residents to refer to this area. Because it relates to the area and is simple and timeless, SIR recommends naming the area "Rio". If someone told you about a new business located at "Rio", would you know how to get to it?

- *Yes, I would know exactly where to go to check it out myself. (31 responses)*
- *I would know the general area, but would need to ask for more information to actually find it. (29 responses)*
- *No, I would not know where to go. (4 responses)*

 - *Rio is a Road so that is not specifically in that intercection alone.*

 - *ambiguous: there's more to Rio than that intersection.*
 - *You must connect "Rio" and "29" on signage because a place called "Rio" already exists: (1) Google search pin-points it to be in the Northfields neighborhood (in a block bounded by Huntington/Dellwood/Rolling Hill/Northfield Roads); (2) On maps [USGS, ADC, DeLorme] "Rio" is just west of where the RR tracks cross East Rio Rd. near Rio School Lane.*

Also, I think the term ""corner"" is confusing since it appears to be referring to an ""area"" rather than sitting AT the corner of the intersection. Words like ""quadrant,"" ""sector,"" or ""area,"" would all be more effective in achieving understanding than ""corner.""*
- *Having now looked ahead, I think I would understand ""Rio-SW"" and that this would be a reasonable and effective descriptor of a focused but broader area."*

What do you think about this name? Does "Rio Ville" resonate with you?

- *I think this is unnecessarily confusing -- you are still in Cville it is NOT a separate town it is a place in Cville. Rio is simple, clean and graphically pleasing*
- *No...Rio/29*
- *Do not care for it. Sorry!*
- *I do not like it at all.*
- *Well, the intersection is the high point on a hill, so why not call it Rio Hill, like the name for the Civil War skirmish.*
