PVCC Student: Linnea Saby Finding a New Calling

After earning a bachelor's degree in environmental studies from Guilford College in Greensboro, N.C., Linnea Saby thought her path was set: She'd return to her hometown of Afton, Va., and take a few courses at PVCC to prepare for future coursework in environmental science.

The Evolution of a Dream

Once she was at PVCC for a semester, however, she realized that getting an associate degree would allow her to more easily transfer into a master's program. She also found a new calling in the process: engineering.

"I was intimidated to join the engineering program at first," said Saby. "But once I started talking to the other students, I quickly realized that it was the right place for me."

A Golden Opportunity

As a result of joining the engineering program, Saby soon received the opportunity to intern at the National Radio Astronomy Observatory (NRAO) in Charlottesville.

Saby spent nine weeks at NRAO as part of a special program offered through the National Astronomy Consortium (NAC). Through the program, NAC interns are paired with astronomy, engineering and physics

professionals at universities, observatories, and NASA facilities for a two-month research

project. Interns also receive training and skills development to prepare them for future success in their STEM careers.

During her internship, Saby worked for the program management department at NRAO and focused her research on methodical project management. Saby

PVCC Student: Fintan Horan Rediscovering the Dream



Fintan Horan is no stranger to PVCC. He first began attending community college at age 16, but was forced to withdraw from school before the semester ended due to a family crisis.

"I ended up entering the workforce, initially working odd jobs before finding my rhythm in the restaurant industry," said Horan. "I quickly moved up the ladder and had my first management job by the age of 20."

Returning to College

Despite his success in the restaurant business, Horan had a dream of returning to school—a dream he held on to despite

obstacles that prevented him from returning as quickly as he would have liked.

"I finally realized that the most important thing for me was to simply take that first step," said Horan. "Everything else can, and will, fall into place. But the longer one spends considering and debating, the less likely action is to be taken."

A Love for Technology

Horan returned to PVCC in fall 2014 and chose to major in computer science.

"Computer science resonates with me," said Horan. "I have always been interested in technology because it allows me to bring together my creative spirit with the technical world. I find computing to be exciting, and the advancements we have seen in the past 10

years have been incredible. I'm excited to be part of it, and, of course, it doesn't hurt that the industry is booming."

Why He Chose PVCC

Many undergraduate classes at four-year universities are huge—100 to 1,000 students—and they are often taught by graduate students. That disconnect doesn't exist at PVCC," said Horan. "I am able to build relationships with my professors, and they know me by my first name. They want to see me succeed and are willing to go out of their way to make sure that I do so."

A Campus & Community Leader

Since his return to college, Horan has been extremely active in campus life. This year, he is serving as president of the PVCC chapter of Mu Alpha Theta, the national math honor society;

Meet Our Faculty

William Pratt Assistant Professor, Business

What He Teaches at PVCC

Bill Pratt teaches a wide variety of business courses including introduction to business, personal finance, corporate finance, financial management, principles of management, principles of marketing, and internship in business.

Background and Credentials

Pratt is originally from Cumberland, Maryland, and now lives in Fluvanna County. Although he had initially intended to go into medicine, Pratt found a love for business and personal finance after taking an economics course in college.

“Business is challenging. It’s like a Sudoku puzzle—it’s a perfectly doable challenge. What business allows us to do is to control our own success. If you put in the right amount of effort, you will be successful.”

He graduated from Frostburg State University with a B.S. degree in economics. Following graduation, Pratt secured a job working as an economist in the Statistics Division of the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) in Washington, D.C. After earning his MBA from Hood College, he worked as the vice president of risk and commercial operations at Citigroup for two years, before returning to work for the federal government. During his time in D.C., Pratt began teaching part-time and soon found that he enjoyed working at his part-time teaching job more than his full-time job and made the decision to transition to teaching.

“The moment I learned something that helped me, I wanted to tell other people. Well before I was a teacher, I was already teaching.”

After his wife secured a position at East Carolina University, Pratt and his wife

moved to Greenville, N.C., where they lived for four years. During that time, Pratt taught business

and finance courses at the university. The couple soon found, however, that they missed being near the mountains, as well as being closer to family and friends, and made the decision to move to Charlottesville. Once in Virginia, Pratt began working at PVCC, and his wife took a job at U.Va. Pratt is now in his third year of teaching at PVCC.

In addition to teaching, Pratt is also an author and has written two books about personal finance: *Extra Credit: The 7 Things Every College Student Needs to Know About Credit, Debt & Cash*, published in 2011, and *The Graduate’s Guide to Life and Money*, also published in 2011.

“I love to be able to see the process—to see students really learn the material. To get feedback. That’s why I love written assignments—you can see the immediate effects of their learning. I love when they get it.”

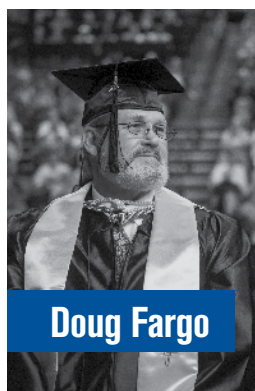
Red Cross Internship Opens Doors for PVCC Graduate

PVCC student Doug Fargo, of Ruckersville, knew that he needed practical, hands-on experience to prepare for a career in disaster relief operations. After receiving volunteer training at the Virginia Baptist Mission Board – Disaster Relief Services (VBMB), Mass Feeding Operations Unit, and the Greene County Community Emergency Response Team (CERT), he wanted to supplement that knowledge by working with an international organization like the Red Cross.

“The training I received through the Red Cross gave me valuable leadership and management skills, not only in disaster relief operations but the functions of a well-respected nonprofit organization,” said Fargo. “The work there enhanced my understanding of management and business administration practices, better preparing me to excel in my PVCC courses and reach my double major graduation goals.”

Fargo says that his favorite part of the internship was working with people who needed assistance.

“Single family home fires are the number one Red Cross disaster response,” said Fargo.

Fargo graduated from PVCC with a double major in management and business administration in May 2015. He continues to remain active in both VBMB and CERT.

Steps to Enrollment for Degree-Seeking

STEP
1

Submit an Online Application to PVCC.

Go to www.pvcc.edu and click on "Apply Now" to complete the Virginia Community College System (VCCS) online application. After completing and submitting your application, you are officially admitted to PVCC, and you will receive a student ID number and username on your confirmation page. Keep this page or write down this information for your records. After applying, go to Step 2 if you are enrolling in a degree or certificate program; otherwise, go to Step 4 if you are simply taking classes without pursuing a degree or certificate.

2

Apply for Financial Aid.

All degree- and certificate-seeking students are encouraged to apply for financial aid. Financial aid may come in the form of grants, scholarships, loans and work-study positions.

The first step is to complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) online at www.fafsa.gov. PVCC's school code is **009928**. Also complete the "Spring Financial Aid form," which is available online at www.pvcc.edu/financialaid or contact the Financial Aid Office.

3

Take Placement Tests and Meet with an Advisor.

Students who plan to apply for financial aid or pursue a degree or certificate at PVCC requiring math or English courses must take placement tests. Tests are administered in the PVCC Testing Center. For hours, visit www.pvcc.edu/hours. There is no fee to take placement tests.

Possible exemptions from taking some or all of the placement tests include:

- SAT scores (within two years) of at least 520 in math and/or 500 in **BOTH** critical reading and writing
- Certain ACT scores (consult with PVCC's Admissions & Advising Center)
- Successful completion of certain college-level math and/or English courses
- AP test scores of three or higher in English and/or math

After taking your placement tests, make an appointment with an advisor in the Admissions & Advising Center.

When to send official transcripts to PVCC: This is necessary if you want to receive transfer credit for previously completed college coursework obtained outside the Virginia Community College System. Only students applying or entering allied health programs (nursing, surgical technology, emergency medical services, sonography or radiography) need to send high school transcripts. Send your official academic transcripts along with a completed Transcript Evaluation Request Form, which can be found at www.pvcc.edu/transcripteval, to the mailing address below. If you attended another Virginia community college, the completed Transcript Evaluation Request Form is still required, but you do not need to send official transcripts.

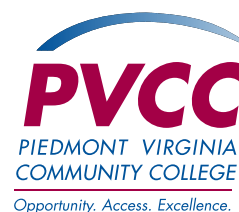
Register and Pay for Classes.

Register for classes online through MyPVCC. (Go to www.pvcc.edu/mypvcc) When prompted, enter the username and password you received when you completed your online PVCC application.

Pay for classes either online through MyPVCC or in person at the Cashier's Office (Main Building, Room M237). Note: You will be dropped from classes if you do not pay tuition and fees by the payment deadline noted in the Payment Information Section below. Deadline for Paying Tuition

Tuesday, January 5, 2016, at 4 p.m.

Students receiving financial aid: If financial aid and scholarships do not cover all charges, you must pay the balance by the deadline noted above or your classes will be dropped.

Students taking employer-paid classes: Provide a letter of authorization from your employer to the PVCC Cashier's Office by the deadline noted above.

Students who do not pay on time will be dropped from class rosters.

Payment Methods

Tuition payments may be made by cash, check, debit, VISA, MasterCard or American Express. For security reasons, credit card payments by telephone are not accepted. Payments must be made online through MyPVCC or in person at the Cashier's Office located in PVCC's Main Building near the North Mall Meeting Room.

Monthly Payment Plan

PVCC offers an interest-free monthly payment plan with tuition payments due December through February for the spring

semester. This is not a loan program. The plan is administered by Nelnet, and there is an enrollment fee. Payments are deducted automatically from your bank account or charged to a credit card/debit card. See www.pvcc.edu/paymentplan to enroll online or call Nelnet at 1.800.609.8056. The payment plan is available only for the fall and spring semesters.

Return Check Policy

PVCC assesses a \$35 service charge for handling returned checks or rejected credit/debit charges. Once you are notified, if PVCC does not receive payment by the due date indicated in the letter from PVCC's Business Office, classes will be dropped.

Refund Policy

Students may withdraw from classes via MyPVCC. Students will be granted a refund for those credits dropped by the published refund dates. (See Academic Calendar on page 9.) Refunds will be processed after the last day to drop or change a course for the semester. There will be no refunds after the published dates in the Academic Calendar.

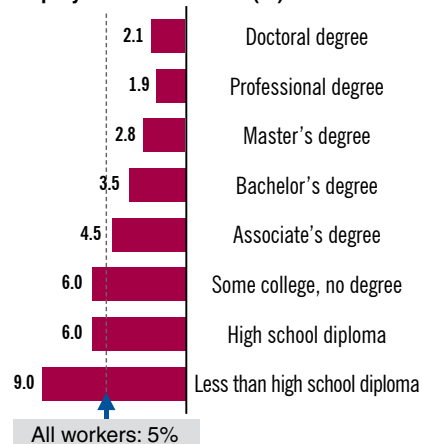

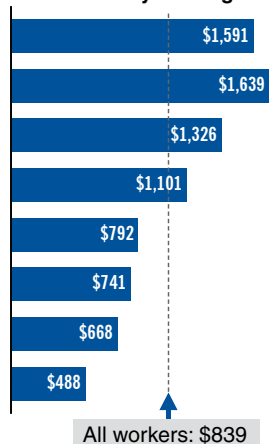
Higher Pay, Lower Unemployment for College-Educated Workers

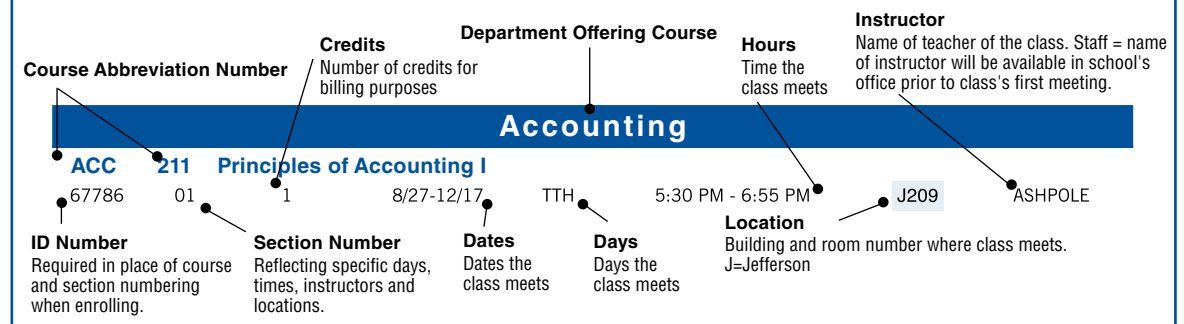

built her own RADIO JOVE receiver and dipole antenna, before training other interns on how to complete their own builds. The RADIO JOVE is an educational learning kit provided by NASA and the RADIO JOVE project.

Saby's research project, "The Value of Methodical Management: Optimizing Science Results," evaluated the different tools and techniques that NRAO staff use to prioritize projects and discussed how project management skills can be specifically tailored to fit the radio astronomy field.

New Leadership Roles

"The internship program was a big confidence builder for me," said Saby. "It was a summer-long crash course in radio astronomy, and I learned so much. It inspired me to take on leadership roles in other engineering projects."

Designing and Building a Racecar

Saby's current engineering project is participating in the Formula SAE design challenge in which she and 30 other engineering students at PVCC will design, fabricate, and eventually race a formula-style car as a part of the international university competition through SAE International.

Each year, the SAE competition brings together more than 100 teams from universities around the world to produce a new formula-style SAE car, which is then

entered in a competition in June. Cars are judged based on performance in eight static and dynamic events: acceleration, skid pad, autocross, fuel economy, endurance track, presentation, engineering design and cost analysis.

As assistant project manager, Saby is a key member of the student leadership team.

"The scope of the Formula SAE project is larger than just creating a car," said Saby. "Racecar engineering is a creative process that leads to new innovations in all different fields, so we have the opportunity to build skills that will help us contribute to a broad range of disciplines."

Looking to the Future

Saby will graduate from PVCC in December 2016. Following graduation, she plans to transfer to a four-year school where she will complete a master's degree in mechanical engineering in order to pursue her dream of working as an engineer at a sustainable energy company.

"I believe that global environmental problems are one of the biggest challenges that my generation faces," said Saby. "I can't think of a better way to devote my career."

New Program Spotlight: Retail Management Program

PVCC's new Retail Management Program will train students to supervise sales associates in a retail establishment. Duties may include management functions, such as purchasing, budgeting, accounting and personnel work, in addition to supervisory duties. Graduates of the program are eligible to sit for the National Retail Federation (NRF) certification exam in retail management.

Jobs in retail management are expected to grow four percent by 2022 in Central Virginia with an average annual salary of \$39,644 (\$19.06 an hour). The retail sector is projected to grow nine percent in Central Virginia by 2022.*

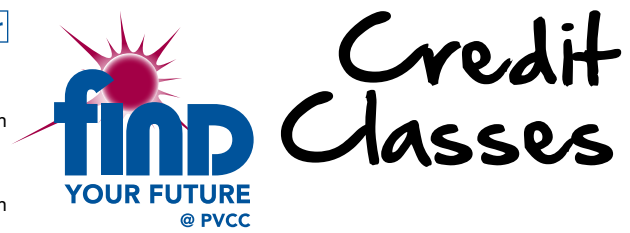

PVCC's new Pharmacy Technician Career Studies Certificate can be completed in two years or less. Consisting of 29 credits, the program prepares students for work as a pharmacy technician in hospitals and retail-based pharmacies. The current average salary for pharmacy techs in Central Virginia is \$13-15 an hour, and economic projections estimate a 27 percent growth in this field over the next 10 years.*

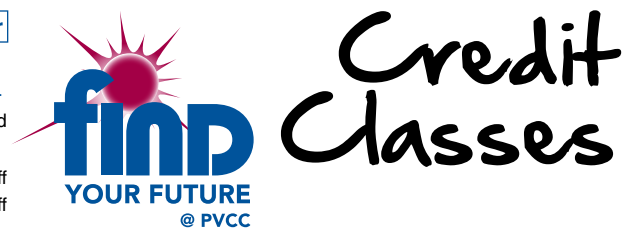

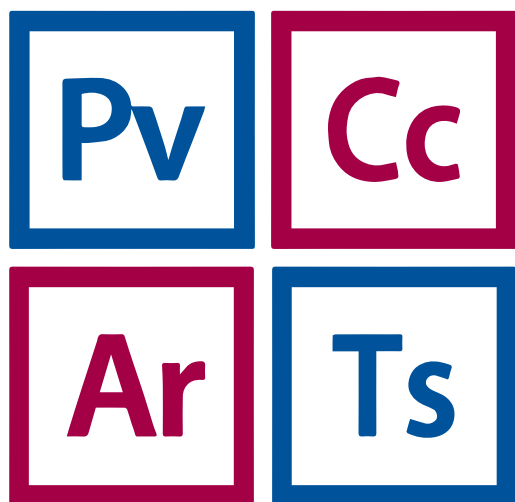

Enrollment

Enrollment in credit classes totaled 7,800 for the 2013-2014 academic year. About 87 percent of PVCC's student population attends part time. On average, 59 percent of our students are female and 41 percent are male. Sixty-three percent are age 24 or younger while 34 percent are age 25 or older. Since the college opened in 1972, more than 213,000 students have taken credit and noncredit classes, and the college has awarded more than 12,000 associate degrees and certificates. Each year, more than 1,300 students leave PVCC to attend a four-year college or university for a bachelor's degree. To date, more than 2,500 students have transferred to the University of Virginia.

Service Region

PVCC serves the educational, career and workforce training needs of Albemarle, Buckingham, Fluvanna, Greene, Louisa and Nelson counties and the city of Charlottesville. While this is our primary service region, some of our students also hail from nearby communities such as Orange and Madison counties.

the treasurer of Phi Theta Kappa; and a peer mentor for the Student Success Office.

In addition to his on-campus activities, Horan volunteers as a mentor at Computers4Kids, a Charlottesville nonprofit organization that seeks to improve low-income youth's computer and learning skills, and is part of the leadership team for the Jefferson Area Board for Aging's FISH (Friends in Schools Helping) program, which is an intergenerational school-based mentoring and volunteer program providing support to help solve critical needs for students in public schools.

Valley Proteins Fellowship

Due to his academic success and his strong leadership skills, Horan was selected as a Valley Proteins Fellow for the 2015-2016 academic year. This prestigious scholarship program, administered by the Virginia Foundation for Community College Education, provides second-year, full-time students with financial resources as well as service opportunities and a unique leadership curriculum. Fellows are selected on the basis of demonstrated academic excellence, leadership potential, and financial need. Horan was one of nine Virginia community college students selected for the award.

"As a self-sustaining student paying for my

own education, the monetary aspect of this award is huge," said Horan. "However, even more important is the prestige associated with this fellowship. Being a part of this fellowship is quite an honor and has the potential to open up new doors for me. The Valley Proteins Fellows program is much more than simply a scholarship. There are many exciting opportunities available to the fellows that I am very much looking forward to."

Horan will graduate from PVCC in 2016. After graduating, he plans to transfer to a four-year college to earn a bachelor's degree in computer science and engineering.

His Message to Future Students
