Our unique student-centered curriculum was written exclusively for ETC. The program has a three-fold focus:

- (1) life skills of conflict resolution, self-control, and anger management;
- (2) passion identification to identify gifts and to formulate a plan to exercise them; and
- (3) targeted counseling to explore behavior modification.

A comparison of ETC alternative course to traditional alternative schools/programs illustrates a humane program and a program that greatly prepares students to return to their home schools and life empowered with skills to conduct themselves appropriately at home, school and in their community.

Alternative Education Comparison

Traditional Alternative Education

- None or limited pre-parent/guardian counseling prior to student being accepted into the program
- None or limited student behavioral expectation given prior to arrival
- No education or career options made available
- No time limit for duration of stay
- No overall school-wide curriculum
- No daily education plan
- None or limited soft skills taught
- Teacher attrition is high
- None or limited individual and group counseling
- No follow-up plans to assist with graduation
- No exit plan

Education Transformation Centre

- Pre-parent/guardian counseling prior to student being accepted into program
- Student expectations are given prior to arrival
- Each student creates an individual education plan prior to entering the program
- Daily education plan
- Time limit on duration of stay (six weeks)
- Curriculum (copyright, 2016) designed exclusively for ETC
- Soft Skills are taught
 - a) Self- evaluation
 - b) Passion Identification
 - c) Individual and Group counseling
 - d) Conflict Resolutions
 - e) Workplace Readiness
 - f) Business and Table etiquette
 - g) Anger Management
 - h) Decision Making
 - i) Goal Writing
 - j) Career and Education options are provided
 - k) Learn to apologize sincerely

- Exit plan for student to successfully return to home high school
