From the Board: Matters Not Listed on the Agenda. <u>Liz Palmer:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Mentioned that Friday and Saturday (April 29-30) were Household Hazardous Waste Amnesty Days, meaning that community members could go to the Ivy MUC and dispose of yard chemicals and pesticides. She said this would take place from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., with the commercial drop-off being on Thursday and the details were on the Albemarle County website. <p><u>Diantha McKeel:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Commented that many of the Supervisors had attended the kickoff that day for the “Let’s Talk Albemarle” van project, thanked staff for the ingenious idea and hoped the Board would receive updates on how that vehicle is used. <p><u>Ann Mallek:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Commented that she hoped the County would be able to have parades this year and hoped the “Let’s Talk Albemarle” van would come so that people could see it. <p><u>Bea LaPisto-Kirtley:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Commented that County staff have been very good stewards of the County finances, spending, and savings during the pandemic and recognized that staff had still given service to the community. Commented that, as part of the “Save the Monarch” project, on 10:00 a.m. on Saturday, May 1, at Darden Towe Park, milkweed seed would be planted, and that mowing would occur only once a year. She commented that there is a natural migration path that goes through Darden Towe Park.
