Stormwater Utility Administration

Staff expect that responsibilities associated with administering the stormwater utility will be shared by the Chief of Environmental Services (existing position), the Management/Budget Analyst (new position), and GIS/Data Analyst (new position). These staff will coordinate – as needed – with staff in the Office of Management and Budget, the Finance Department, and the Office of Geographic Data Services.

In total, the administration of the stormwater utility is expected to require less than one FTE position.
