## RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, due to recent rainfall and now adequate reservoir supply, the Rivanna Water and Sewer Authority ("RWSA") rescinded a Drought Warning and Drought Emergency on November 14, 2017 for the public water supply which serves the County of Albemarle and the City of Charlottesville; and

WHEREAS, the water levels of the reservoirs, particularly the South Fork Rivanna Reservoir, have increased in recent days due to rainfall and mandatory water restrictions are no longer necessary; and

WHEREAS, Section 16-02 B of the Albemarle County Service Authority's ("ACSA") Rules and Regulations provides that the ACSA Board of Directors shall request the Board of Supervisors to rescind the Declaration of Emergency based upon the Board of Directors determining that a water emergency in Albemarle County no longer exists;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Albemarle County Service Authority, that it is hereby determined that a Water Emergency in Albemarle County no longer exists; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Executive Director of the Albemarle County Service Authority is duly authorized to notify ACSA Customers that the Drought Emergency and Drought Warning have been lifted, following the rescinding of the Declaration of an Emergency by the Albemarle County Board of Supervisors; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Albemarle County Board of Supervisors is hereby requested to rescind the Declaration of a Water Emergency and declare that there is not a need to continue to impose restrictions for water use.
