#### Reason to Serve:

According to the most recent research by the UVA Systems Engineering team, lead by the Thomas Jefferson Area Criminal Justice Planner, Neal Goodloe, every week at least 10 people with serious mental illness are booked into ACRJ. At any given time, between 20-30% of the jail's population has a serious mental illness. ACRJ is our community's largest provider of mental health services. Yet there is not a single mental health professional on the ACRJ Board. I would like to change that. ACRJ is regularly recognized for being on the forefront of developments in criminal corrections. Appointing a mental health professional to the ACRJ Board would be one more way our community can stand out as committed to improving criminal justice practices. As my resume shows, I have worked hard to improve outcomes for people with mental illness in the criminal justice system. This past General Assembly session, Delegate Rob Bell sponsored a bill requiring the development of mental health treatment standards in local jails. It was the only bill that passed both chambers unanimously this session. The Department of Corrections has asked The Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services (DBHDS) to develop the standards, and in my capacity as Policy Chair for Mental Health America of Virginia I have the privilege of consulting with the Department on the standards development. I would like to bring my experience in this role to benefit ACRJ and use my connections within DBHDS to highlight the good work ACRJ is already doing for inmates with mental illness. Partner for Mental Health, the organization of which I am Executive Director, is committed to working at the intersection of the criminal justice system and mental illness. In addition to consulting at the state level for the development of uniform mental health care standards at jails, we helped create the local Therapeutic Docket (a jail diversion program for people with mental illness) and serve on the Docket's advisory Board and treatment team, and serve on the Evidence Based Decision Making Team of the Jefferson Area Community Criminal Justice Board. Serving of the Board of ACRJ would be another manifestation of our commitment to this work. I look forward to bringing my experience to serve ACRJ and help improve our already strong local facility.
